Dear parents/carers,

This week the children in years 2 to 6 have been completing a range of assessments in maths, reading, spelling and grammar. These assessments will provide class teachers with information to support planning and intervention groups to best support the children across the school. Our year 1 children have also engaged in a phonics screen check to assess how confident they are in identifying the phonics sounds they have been taught so far this term. We will use the information from these assessments to best support our year 1 children as they progress through our Floppy Phonics reading scheme.

Christmas Nativity and Christingle Service

The children in class 1 and 2 have begun their rehearsals for their Christmas Nativity performance which will be taking place on Tuesday 10th December in Lovacott Village Hall. There will be a morning performance which will begin at 9:30am and an evening performance at 5pm, everyone is welcome to join us.



Class 3 and 4 have also begun practicing some Christmas carols they will be singing in our Christingle service on Wednesday 18th December at 2:45pm in the Gospel Hall, again we are looking forward to welcoming parents along to our service.



Year 4 Multiplication Parents Information

Next Wednesday 3rd December at 3pm, Mrs Hopkins will be leading a parent's workshop for our year 4 parents on the multiplication check that the children will be completing in June next year. This session will provide information about the expectations of the check and advice on how you can best support your child/ren to learn and remember their tables for quick recall. Looking forward to seeing everyone there.

Staff Updates

Over the past few weeks, I have been showing several teachers around the school who have been interested in applying for the class teacher post to begin in class 2 in January. Mr Polak and I will be holding interviews for the class teacher post next Friday 6th December. Mr Boyle will continue to lead the teaching and learning in class 2 until the end of the term.

Why is attendance so important?

According to the Department for Education's data:

Pupils who attend school regularly are more likely to develop positive relationships with peers and teachers, enhancing their overall emotional resilience and mental health.

Pupils with good attendance records are more likely to achieve better grades.

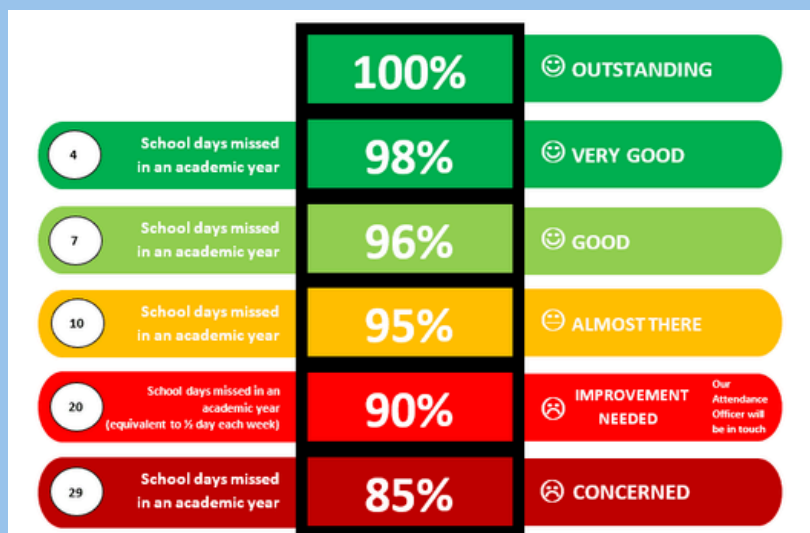
Pupils who consistently attend school are more likely to pursue higher education and ultimately secure better employment opportunities.

Pupils who are chronically absent are more likely to feel isolated and disengaged as well as being at higher risk of not continuing their education after secondary school.

Regular school attendance fosters a sense of belonging and connection within the school community.

Higher attendance rates lead to improved academic performance, as pupils have more opportunities to learn, join discussions and receive feedback from teachers

Class 3

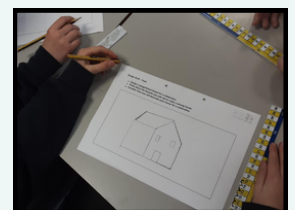
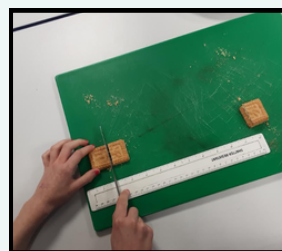
Class 3 have been enjoying dance classes in the village hall.

Curtis has donated some of his old toys not only to breakfast club but has also handed some into the Lovacott nursery as well! Well done Curtis!!

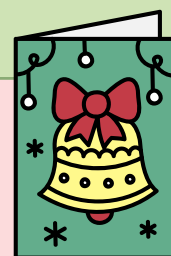


Christmas Cards in School

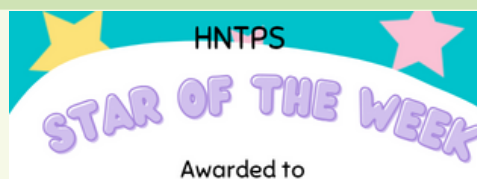

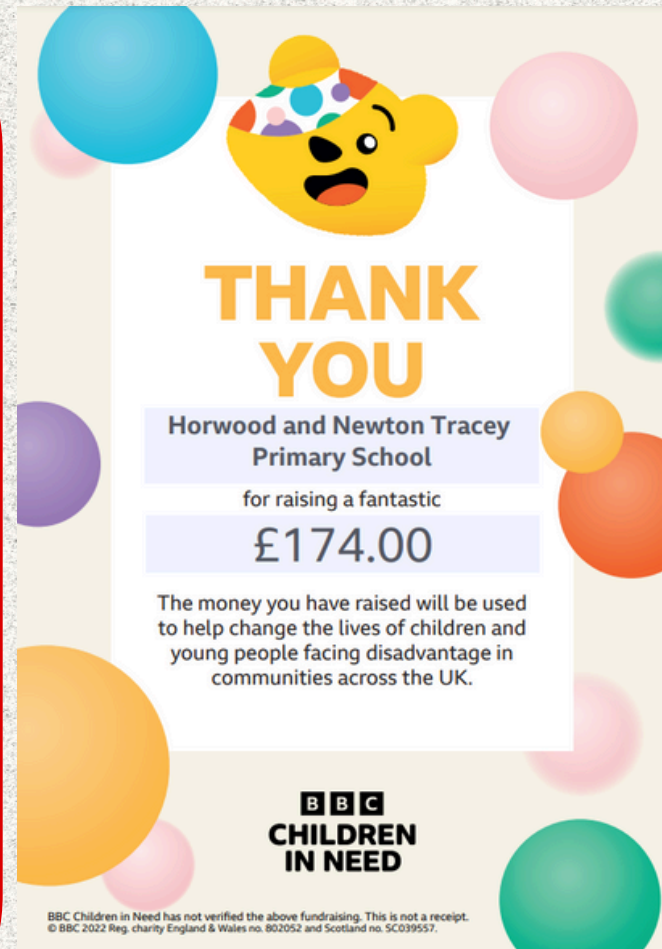

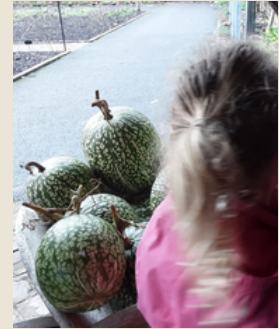

Foundation Stage Class trip to RHS Rosemoor Wednesday 27th November 2024



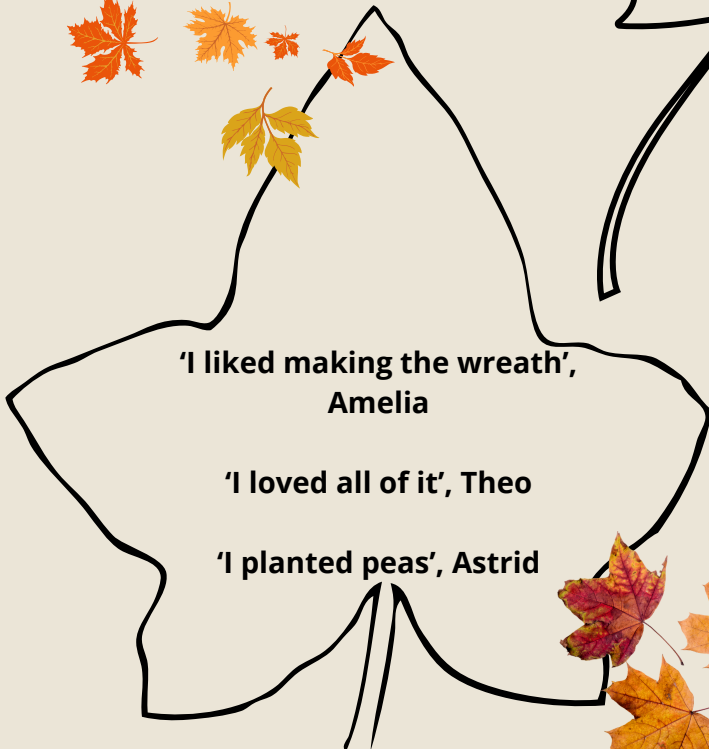

Lockdown Procedures in Primary Schools: test next week

We would like to inform you that a lockdown test is planned for next week at some point during the week. This will help ensure everyone is familiar with the procedures.

We'll always notify you about scheduled drills or real lockdowns. Please help us by reassuring your child about the importance of these drills and ensuring your contact information is up to date.

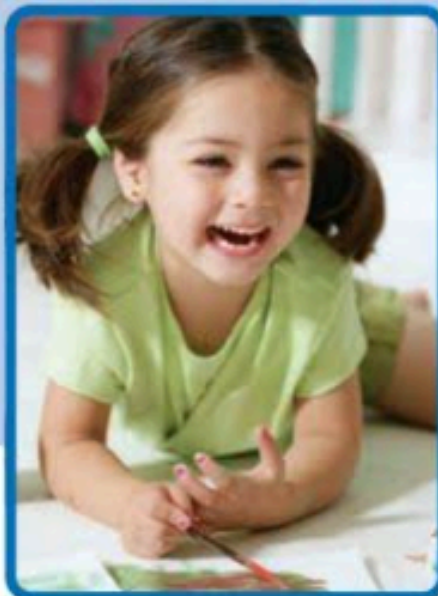
