Dear parents and carers,



We are really into the swing of learning now and it has been a great week across the school with lots of hard work. We are particularly proud of class 4, especially our Year 6s, who have been working their socks off in preparation for SATs week. With just over a week to go, we have been helping them to prepare so that they can feel really confident, as we want this to be as stress free as possible for them. At the same time, this is a really useful opportunity for them to consolidate all of the most important knowledge and skills that they have learnt over their time at primary school. During SATs week, there will be the usual SATs breakfast to start each day for all in Year 6, so please sign your child up if they would like to come.

We have some really exciting news! Next week, the school will be adopting a leopard gecko! This is a wonderful opportunity for our children to learn about looking after a pet with very different needs to their own, as well as understanding more about habitats and diet. It will also provide a chance for us to develop an area that will help soothe and provide a quiet and reflective space in school for our children to relax and observe the gecko.

This week you may have seen our monthly online safety newsletter, which was focused on mental health. There were some really startling facts including: 'Recent research from Ofcom reported that "34% of parents of children aged 3-4 said it (digital addiction) was hard to control, rising to half (49%) of parents of children aged 16-17.' Screens and online use is something which has had a pervasive creep into our lives. There are of course many benefits to having such a wealth of information at our fingertips, but in the future I wonder how we will look back and think about how we allowed our children to use screens now. The newsletter is full of lots of useful information and links to ways that we can help build healthy habits to support children with screen use, so please do take a look.

After the rather chilly start to May, fingers crossed there will be some good weather over the long weekend, and we can all have some quality time outside together.
